Act and Acceptance of Retrockasion Pursuant to MINN, STAT, 1.0437

HHEREAS, the State of Minnesota has previously coded exclusive legislative jurisdiction to the United States of America over all lands at the United States Army Reserve Conter, Arden Hills, Minnesota, which Consists of 29.04 acres, more or less;

WHEREAS, Title 10, United States Code, Section 2683 authorises the Secretary of the Army to retroceds all or part of the legislative jurisdiction which the United States has acquired over real property under the charge and control of the Department of the Army in the State or Commonwealth of the United States where the property is located; and

**WHEREAS, the State of Minnesota, pursuant to MINN. STAT. Section 1.0431 (1995) suthorizes a procedure for acceptance of such retrocession and recordation thereof;

. WHIREAS, the Covernor of the State of Minnesota, as required by law, has consulted with the affected counties and municipalities where the lands are situated,

MHEREAS, the Rammey County Board and the Arden Hills City Council have by resolution recommended acceptance of the offer of retrocassion;

NOW THEREPORE, the United States of America retrocedes to the State of Minnesota concurrent jurisdiction over all lands present at the United States Arden Hills Center, comprising 29.04 acres, more or lass. This area is described as follows:

The South 1150.0 feet of the East 1100 feet of the SEX of Section 15, Township 30 North, Range 23 West, of the 4th Principal Maridian, Ransey County, Minnesota.

The tract of land herein described convains 19.84 acres, more or less.

State and local law enforcement agencies are hereby authorized to investigate criminal offenses under the laws of the State of Minnesots and local laws and ordinances, to make arrests, and to administratively process cases through the courts of the State of Minnesots and local courts therein with regard to the property.

This retrocession will apply for state and local enforcement and courts concurrently with such federal jurisdiction as exists under 40 U.S.C. 318, 318a, 318b, 18 U.S.C. 11, and such other federal statutes that are applicable.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN CITY OF ARDEN HILLS AND

DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY, 88TH REGIONAL SUPPORT COMMAND FORT SNELLING, MINNESOTA

day of 1995, and is entered into by and between the U.S. Department of the Army, U.S. Army Reserve, 88th Regional Support Command (all aforementioned herein "88th RSC") and the City of Arden Hills (herein "City"), a municipal corporation and political subdivision of the State of Minnesota.

2.0 Recitals.

- A. WHEREAS, the 88th RSC currently occupies property which is within the corporate boundaries of the City and which is located in the Northwest Quadrant of the intersection of Lexington Avenue and Highway 96 (herein the "Army Reserve Site");
- B. WHEREAS, the 88th RSC has formally requested the City to consider a change in the jurisdiction of the Army Reserve Site from an exclusive jurisdiction to a concurrent jurisdiction;
- C. WHEREAS, the 88th RSC is committed to supporting the public activities of the City;
- D. WHEREAS, the parties desire to establish a longer term and closer working relationship with each other in regard to the use and regulation of the Army Reserve Site;
- E. WHEREAS, the Army Reserve Site is currently included in an R-1 Zoning District on the City's Zoning Map and within an area designated as commercial on the City's Comprehensive Plan Land Use Map;
- F. WHEREAS, the parties recognize the existing Army Reserve Site as a legal, nonconforming use as defined under Section IX of the City's Zoning Ordinance;
- G. WHEREAS, the Army Reserve Site will be designated as a public use under Section II.D.113 of the Arden Hills Zoning Ordinance upon the establishment of a concurrent jurisdiction;
- H. WHEREAS, the parties recognize that should the 88th RSC change the facility and/or site plan for the Army Reserve Site in the future, the 88th RSC will be required to

comply with the City's development regulations including the application for a Special Use Permit;

- I. WHEREAS, the parties desire to formalize and record their understandings concerning the Army Reserve Site by this documentation; and
- J. WHEREAS, the parties to this Memorandum of Agreement understand that there will be mutual benefits to each other as a result of the change in the jurisdiction which governs the Army Reserve Site of the Army Reserve Center.
- 3.0 Terms and Conditions. NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual undertakings herein expressed, the parties agree as follows:
 - A. The City of Arden Rills will coordinate with Ramsey County and respond favorably to comments requested by the Governor's Office of the State of Minnesota regarding the change in jurisdictional status of the real property on which the Reserve Center is located.
 - B. It is understood by the parties that a change from exclusive jurisdiction to concurrent jurisdiction will result in certain fundamental changes in the relationship between the Department of the Army and the City of Arden Hills that is permanent and unaffected by this Memorandum. These changes include but are not limited to:
 - 1. The real estate subject to the retrocession of jurisdiction and on which the Reserve Center Site is located will be subject to the City's development regulations.
 - The City shall be responsible for providing normal fire and police protection services to the Army Reserve Site at its cost but the 88th RSC will be required to reimburse the City for the costs of unusual or extraordinary line and police protection provided such reimbursement is allowed by federal law. It is the desire of the parties that all such costs be anticipated and discussed prior to being incurred.
 - 3. The Army Reserve Site and its tenants shall become subject to the laws and regulations of the State of Minnesota and the City of Arden Hills. Some of these regulations include but are not limited to:
 - a. Allowing access to the Army Reserve Site by local police and fire personnel in the

performance of their duties;

- Compliance with local health and safety regulations including environmental laws;
- c. The imposition of legitimate user fees by the City consistent with the imposition of such fees against other real estate within the City consistent with federal, state and city laws and regulations.
- C. The parties agree that Arden Hills shall have a 5 year Outgrant or License that will allow it to use the Reserve Center for the following public purposes:
 - Park & Recreation Committee, 4th Tuesday of each month, 7-9:30 p.m.
 - Recreation Programs, Tuesday and Thursday of each week, 5:30 p.m.
 - 3. Council Meetings, 2nd and last Monday of each month, 7:00 p.m.
 - 4. Planning Commission, 1st Wednesday of each month, 7:00 p.m.
 - 5. Other regularly scheduled times include the 3rd Thursday of each month at 8:00-9:00 a.m. and every other Wednesday night at 7:00-10:00 p.m.
 - 6. Polling place during elections.
- D. The City understands and agrees that the mission of the 88th RSC and the Army Reserve Site and its tenant units is paramount and takes precedence over any use by the City, but consistent with this understanding every effort will be made to accommodate the activities listed in paragraph C and any additional activities that may be requested in the future.
- E. The City understands that it may undertake a use of the Army Reserve Site that results in extraordinary energy use or clean up costs or other unforeseen costs that could be charged back to the City. No costs will be charged back without notice and an opportunity for discussion: It is the desire of the parties that all such costs be anticipated and discussed prior to being incurred.
- F. Sections 3.0 (C) (D) and (E) of this Memorandum are effective only until an Outgrant or License can be

processed through channels incorporating the proposed public uses of the City, the five-year term and other standard and appropriate clauses. It is anticipated that this Outgrant or License will be reviewed after each five-year term and renewed for subsequent five-year periods.


