WHEREAS: The Igbos are one of the major ethnic groups of Nigeria; and

WHEREAS: There are thousands of Igbo residents in Minnesota, some of whom have lived in

Minnesota for more than forty years; and

WHEREAS: Igbos in Minnesota formed the Umunne Cultural Association of Minnesota in

1985, a non-profit organization formed to unite and educate Igbos, their families,

and all Minnesotans about Igbo culture, art, music, and values through

community activities; and

WHEREAS: The Ummune Cultural Association has been involved with causes such as breast

cancer, education, the arts, volunteering in local schools and organizations, book

drives, and cultural performances at local festivals; and

WHEREAS: The Ummune Cultural Association hosted the first IgboFest in 1994 in order to

celebrate the rich heritage of the Igbos and educate Minnesotans about their

culture; and

WHEREAS: The Umunne Cultural Association is celebrating the 25th Annual IgboFest on

August 11, 2018 at North Hennepin Community College in Brooklyn Park.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARK DAYTON, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, August 11, 2018, as:

IGBOS IN MINNNESOTA DAY

in the State of Minnesota.
