

DETAILS: Minn. Stat. ch. 8 gives the Attorney General the responsibility and authority to be the state's counsel and to perform all the legal business of the state. Upon the request of the Minnesota Department of Revenue (hereinafter "the Department"), I delegate Michael Fenton authority to provide legal advice and assistance to the Department regarding, (1) tax issues, (2) the collection of both tax and non-tax related debt, (3) the expungement of liens or other documents unlawfully filed against Department employees, and (4) issues involving the Minnesota State Board of Assessors ("the Board"). I also delegate Michael Fenton the authority to provide legal advice and assistance to the Board. This delegation includes a limited authority to appear on behalf of the Department in state district court probate proceedings in connection with claims of the Department. Such legal advice, assistance and authority shall not involve the authority to litigate except in probate proceedings as described and shall be subject to the direction and legal advice of the Attorney General's Office. The Delegatee's authority is further defined and limited by his position description. This delegation terminates immediately when Delegatee is no longer employed by, or is no longer working in the same capacity, for the Department, or at the discretion of the Attorney General. An Assistant Attorney General shall be available to provide consultation on all legal matters.
