- 1. Authority to conduct administrative appeals under the appeals process established by Minnesota Statutes, sections 256.045 through 256.046. This includes the authority to:
- · administer oaths;
- issue subpoenas, temporary orders staying demission, protective orders and other interim orders as allowed by law, policy and procedure;
- order independent examinations pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, section 256.045, subdivisions 4a and 6;
- · conduct administrative hearings and prehearings; and
- make written recommended decisions to the Commissioner.
- 2. Authority to issue dismissal orders for administrative appeals established by Minnesota Statutes, section 256.045 through 256.046. This authority is limited to situations when the appellant in the appeal:
- fails to appear at the hearing and does not provide good cause for the failure; or
- · makes a clear statement withdrawing the appeal.
- 3. Authority to conduct administrative appeals under the appeals process established by Minnesota Statutes, section 256B.50. This includes the authority to:
- review appeals in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, section 256B.50, subdivision 1c(a) and (b); and
- make written recommended decisions to the Commissioner.
- 4. Authority to conduct administrative appeals under the appeals process established by Minnesota Statutes, section 256,9685. This includes the authority to:
- review appeals in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, section 256.9685, subdivision 1b; and
- make written recommended decisions to the Commissioner.
- 5. Authority to conduct administrative appeals under the appeals process established by Minnesota Statutes, section 256G.09. This includes the authority to:
- · review appeals in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, section 256G.09, subdivisions 2 and 3, and
- · make written recommended decisions to the Commissioner.
