- WHEREAS: The state of Minnesota places a high value on such farms, and appreciates their role in feeding our state and world.


NOW, THEREFORE, I, TIM PAWLENTY, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, July 5, 2003, to be:


## KRAMER FAMILY FARM DAY
