WHEREAS:	NF can lead to blindness, deafness, bone abnormalities, disfigurement, learning disabilities, disabling pain, and cancer; and
WHEREAS:	The State of Minnesota supports efforts to promote awareness, foster collaborative partnerships, and improve access to proper treatment and care; and
WHEREAS:	Much remains to be done in raising public awareness of NF to help promote early diagnosis, proper management and treatment, prevention of complications, and support for research; and
WHEREAS:	Neurofibromatosis Awareness Month is an opportunity to educate the public about this rare genetic disorder.
