DECLARATION OF TRUST

IN THIS YEAR OF THE LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED NINETY FIVE, This agreement and Declaration of Trust has been established by Joseph H. Kerkvliet and Frances M. Kerkvliet (hereinafter referred to as the Organizers) who reside at 405 S. Bruce Street, Marshall, Minnesota 56258. They have joined themselves together in these presents in an effort set forth pursuant to the provisions of this Declaration of Trust. The Organizers have appointed Joseph H. Kerkvliet and Frances M. Kerkvliet to serve as Trustee(s). They agree to serve as Trustee(s) until resignation, incapacity or death.

ARTICLE I.

The Business Trust name shall be:

"JFK ENTERPRISES"

ARTICLE II.

ARTICLE IV.

The duration of this Business Trust shall be perpetual and the effective date of commencement is:
MAY 1ST, 1995

ARTICLE V.

As Trustee(s) of the property transferred to this Business Trust, in which is organized under the CHAPTER 318 of the Corporation laws of Minnesota, we do hereby agree and declare that by the provisions contained herein we purpose ourselves together to enable the Trustee(s) to receive, hold and manage the property of the Trust. The Trustee(s) declare that all property that is received held or hereafter acquired for the Trust shall be assets of the Trust. All income and profits therefrom shall be managed, administered, received, collected, disposed of or distributed by the Trustee(s) or the Successor Trustee(s). ARTICLE VIII.

ARTICLE X.

Any Trustee(s) hereunder may acquire, hold and dispose of shares in this Business Trust to the same extent and in the same manner as if he or she were not a Trustee and without affecting in any way their status or power. All Certificates of Shares shall bear on the face thereof a disclosure statement stating that such certificates are limited to transfer and its members are designated as the beneficial interests as is defined by the Trustee(s). In the event of death or the desire to dispose of the same, such can only take place in accordance with the regulations of the Business Trust as established by said Trustee(s).

ARTICLE XI.

The Trustee(s) may incorporate different aspects of the Business Trust enterprise in states it may choose to do business in and such stock may be owned by the Business Trust the same as an individual or corporation. Compensation of the Trustee(s) shall be determined by the Trustee(s) as a part of governing and administering the Business Trust.

ARTICLE XV.

Any act by the Trustee(s), or by the officers or agents of the Business Trust under authority from the Trustee(s), officers or agent, be conclusively deemed to be within the purposes of this Business Trust and within the powers of the Trustee(s). The Trustees whom were also the Grantors, did in fact occupy the premises at the time of assessment shall have a Life Estate to reside in the dwelling house and are entitled to have property classified as homestead pursuant to Minnesota Statute 273.124.



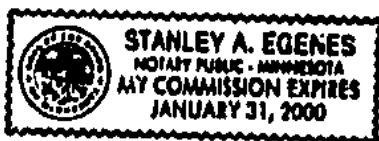



They have joined themselves together in these presents in an effort set forth pursuant to the provisions of this Declaration of Trust.

Medical Care Reimbursement Plan Benefits:

"JFK Enterprises" will reimburse all eligible employees for expenses incurred on or after the effective date of the plan by themselves, their spouses, and their dependents (as defined in section 152 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (the code), as amended) for medical care (as defined in Section 213(d)(1) of the code) subject to the conditions and limitations hereinafter set forth. It is the intention of the business that the benefits payable to these eligible employees hereunder be excluded from their gross income pursuant to Section 105 of the code.

Employees Eligible to Participate: The term "eligible employees" as used in this Plan means all of the employees of the Business Except (a) employees who have not attained age 25 prior to the beginning of the plan year,

Limitation: Reimbursement or payment provided under this plan will be made by the Business only in the event and to the extent that such reimbursement or payment is not provided under any insurance policy(ies), whether owned by the Business or the eligible employee, or under any other health and accident or wage continuation plan. In the event there is such an insurance policy or plan in effect providing for reimbursement in whole or in part, then to the extent of the coverage under such policy or plan the Business is relieved of any and all liability hereunder.

Submission of Proof: Any eligible employee applying for reimbursement under this Plan will submit to the Business, at least annually, all bills for medical care (including premium notices for accident or health insurance) for verification by the Business prior to payment. Failure to comply herewith may, at the discretion of the Business, terminate such eligible employee's right to said reimbursement. It is not necessary that the medical expense be paid by the eligible employee at the time reimbursement is sought, but merely that, if not yet paid, there exists an obligation on the part of the employee to pay the medical expense.

Payment: The Business may, at its discretion, pay directly all or any part of the medical expenses in lieu of making reimbursement thereof. In such event, the Business is relieved of all further responsibility with regard to such medical expenses.

Amendment: This plan may be amended at any time by the Business, Provided the amendment, will not retroactively preclude reimbursement with regard to any medical care expense incurred prior to the amendment effective date or its adoption date.

Discontinuation: This Plan is subject to termination at any time by the Business, provided, however that medical care expenses incurred prior to such termination will be reimbursed or paid in accordance with the terms of this Plan.

Determination: The owner of the Business determines all questions arising from the administration and interpretation of the Plan. Any such action of the owner is binding and conclusive upon all eligible employees.

Effective Date and Plan Year: The effective date of the Plan is the effective date of the trust. The Plan year is the same as the tax year of the Business.

Notification: The Business will promptly notify all employees covered by this Plan and will receive an acknowledgment from each eligible employee of his or her acceptance of the Plan by means of a signature, which is set forth below.

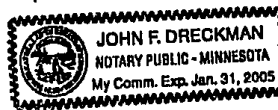
