Proclamation

WHEREAS: Muscular dystrophy is an umbrella term covering more than 52 different types of muscular and

neuromuscular diseases ranging in severity, rather than a single disease or disorder that affects

everyone in the same way; and

WHEREAS: All muscular dystrophies result in progressive muscle weakness ranging from mild muscle

weakness to complete paralysis of all voluntary muscles, including those used for breathing and/or

swallowing; and

WHEREAS: More than one million individuals in the United States are affected by one of the different types of

muscular disorders; and

WHEREAS: Muscular dystrophy strikes people regardless of race, gender, age, or ethnicity; and

WHEREAS: Research has yielded new drugs to treat four types of muscular diseases, including Duchenne,

Spinal Muscular Atrophy, Myasthenia Gravis, and Lou Gehrig's - ALS; and

WHEREAS: Raising public awareness of these diseases will continue to facilitate the discovery of treatments

and cures, as well as bring much needed funding for support and services for those affected by

muscular and neuromuscular diseases; and

WHEREAS: Light it Up Green for Muscular Dystrophy Awareness Month is a special opportunity to educate

the public about muscular and neuro-muscular disorders, as well as the issues these families face in

our communities.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TIM WALZ, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of August 2021, as:

LIGHT IT UP GREEN FOR MUSCULAR DYSTROPHY AWARENESS MONTH
