WHEREAS:

Team USA's Sunisa (Suni) Lee won Olympic gold on Thursday, July 29, 2021, in the

Tokyo Olympics Gymnastics individual all-around competition; and

WHEREAS:

Lee reached the podium in every other Tokyo Olympics women's gymnastics event, winning gold in the team competition, silver in the floor exercise, and bronze on the

uneven bars; and

WHEREAS:

18-year-old Lee from Saint Paul, Minnesota, is the first Hmong-American to compete in

the Olympics; and

WHEREAS:

Lee and her teammates have trained through adversity, including her father's injury, the COVID-19 pandemic, and competing at venues without a live audience cheering them on;

and

WHEREAS:

Lee has made our state and country proud by etching her name among the legendary

USA Olympians that have won gold at the Summer Olympic Games.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TIM WALZ, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Friday, July 30, 2021, as:

SUNISA LEE DAY

in the State of Minnesota.
