

Proclamation

WHEREAS: The concept of landing armed troops into combat zones was first conceived of by General Billy

Mitchell soon after the end of World War I and was proved in the first recorded jump at Kelly

Field in San Antonio, Texas; and

WHEREAS: The United States military, although pioneering the idea of an airborne insertion of troops, did

not put the idea into practice until April of 1940 when the War Department formed a platoon of

Airborne Infantry; and

WHEREAS: The Army's first airborne test jump by Lieutenant William T. Ryder and Private William "Red"

King of the newly organized test platoon was held on August 16, 1940, at Lawson Field; and

WHEREAS: The first parachute combat unit was the 501st Parachute Battalion and the 502nd was created

on July 1, 1941, with many of the men volunteering from the 501st; and

WHEREAS: Since the creation of airborne combat units in the days immediately preceding World War II,

United States Airborne units have been involved in combat insertions in conflicts in Vietnam

and Grenada; and

WHEREAS: Having served with distinction and valor whenever called upon, these elite Airborne Troops are

deserving of recognition for their dedication;

NOW THEREFORE, I, ARNE H. CARLSON, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim August 16, 1998 to be

Birth of the Airborne Day

in Minnesota.
