Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Schumacher's New Prague Hotel is celebrating its centennial, having first opened on November 12, 1898, as the Broz Hotel; and
- WHEREAS: The hotel was designed by renowned architect Cass Gilbert, who also designed the Minnesota State Capitol, it is an architectural treasure and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places; and
- WHEREAS: Schumacher's New Prague Hotel is one of the few hotels that has offered hospitality to the community for 100 consecutive years, 25 of which have been under the ownership of John and Kathleen Schumacher; and
- WHEREAS: Schumacher's New Prague Hotel is nationally known, having been featured in more than three hundred publications, including *Gourmet*, *County Inns* magazine and *Better Homes and Gardens*; and
- WHEREAS: The Schumacher's were named 1998 Innkeeper of the Year by the Minnesota Association of Innkeepers; and
- WHEREAS: John and Kathleen Schumacher will be celebrating the hotel's centennial by saluting all 100-year-old Minnesotans and serving a meal for the price of the original dinner served in 1898, at just \$1;

NOW THEREFORE, I, ARNE H. CARLSON, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim November 12, 1998 to be
