WHEREAS: Minnesota has one of the strongest ceramic art traditions in the United States; and

WHEREAS: Many important national and international aesthetic trends have originated in our state; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota's ceramic artists have made vital contributions to our visual environment, our spirit of creativity and our economy; and

WHEREAS: The work of the ceramic artist enhances the daily lives of Minnesotans in our home furnishings, our architecture and our decorative art; and

WHEREAS: Ceramic arts play an important role in the aesthetic education of young people and adults by developing creative problem-solving; and

WHEREAS: The National Council on Education for the Ceramic Arts is holding a major conference, NCECA '95: Borderline Clay, in Minneapolis on March 22-25, 1995, hosted by the University of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS: Numerous galleries, museums, and arts centers in the Twin Cities will be mounting exhibitions in conjunction with the national event;

NOW THEREFORE, I, ARNE H. CARLSON, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of March, 1995 to be
