WHEREAS: On September 16, 1810, Miguel Hidalgo y Costilla, a pastor in the town of

Dolores, in the state of Guanajuato, Mexico, prepared the people in his area and

called for rebellion against Spanish rule; and

WHEREAS: Within a month, Father Hidalgo and more than 50,000 men (mostly the poorest

indigenous Mexicans) controlled several large Mexican cities and were about to

enter Mexico City, when Father Hidalgo ordered them to retreat; and

WHEREAS: Father Hidalgo was eventually tried and executed during the Spanish

Inquisition, but the revolution he started continued, and with the help of 400

priests, Mexicans won their independence from Spain; and

WHEREAS: Every year, September 16 is celebrated in commemoration of Mexico's first

proclamation of independence from Spain in 1810; and

WHEREAS: Hispanic Americans are the fastest growing ethnic group in the United States;

and

WHEREAS: The State of Minnesota welcomes and appreciates the social, economic, and
