Proclamation

commitment and sacrifice of the people of Hungary in the pursuit of freedom and democracy, beginning with the Hungarian Revolution of 1956; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota congratulates Hungary on the commencement of a year-long

celebration marking the 50th anniversary of the Hungarian Revolution; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota applauds Hungary's remarkable achievements in joining the North

Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) and the European Union; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota appreciates the many contributions Hungarian – Americans have

made to the advancement of the State of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS: Minnesota welcomes the expansion of friendship and cooperative relations

with the Republic of Hungary; and

WHEREAS: The State of Minnesota bestows great respect for Hungary's historic struggle

and triumph in the pursuit of liberty.

Now, Therefore, I, TIM PAWLENTY, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Monday, October 23, 2006, as:

HUNGARIAN FREEDOM DAY

in the State of Minnesota.
